A MEETING OF PLAINS PRESBYTERIAN GOVERNANCE COUNCIL was held on Tuesday 27th July Rev. Johanna Warren led us in a discussion of Alpine Presbytery Reflections for Local Ministry Teams – Our Family Banner – looking at the kind of community we seek to be. Updating of Rolls a work in progress Membership Rolls will be kept separate from Households under Pastoral Care. When a vote is taken only Members and Associates may vote. Resignation of Denis Brown as Parish Clerk was received with regret and appreciation of the work Denis has done since the inception of Plains Parish.

Mayfield Manse: Work in progress – will be dealt with by Property Committee Regional Reports as per agenda received Mayfield reported that windows at Carew church are fixed following vandalism. Contact has been made with Johanna regarding restorative justice for perpetrator.

<u>Finance & Property</u>: G. James explained Financial Reports which are not audited yet. Position of Treasurer has been advertised in Bulletin and Snowfed in Methven but no responses so far.

Methven Manse – working on maintenance – may need Insulation Certificate before it can be rented out. MSB will report to Parish via Governance Council and Congregations as they review The overall parish and type of Ministry for the future.

<u>Communications</u>: Survey results – poor response. Elsa would be happy to produce Plains Speaking and was grateful to Dorothy for her help with contributions. It was felt that the Plains Speaking in important as means of communicating with parish and an issue be produced sooner rather than later.

<u>Annual Reports</u> to be collated separately <u>All reports to be sent to Joan or Elsa by 16th August please</u>. It was agreed that we adopt Draft Guidelines for meetings of Governance and Mission/Focus Groups and Guidelines for the Role of Elders during Ordained Vacancy

Promises

"Not one of all the good promises the LORD your God gave you has failed. Every promise has been fulfilled; not one has failed." Joshua 23:14, NIV

I wonder how many times you or I have said we would do something, such as make a phone call, write a letter, or invite someone for a meal, and we've failed to do it. It's easy to mean what we say when we make a promise, but not always so easy to remember and stick to it. Thankfully God's not like that. He's utterly faithful to every one of His promises. Joshua was able to remind the people of that before he died. What about you? Are there promises in your life that you're holding on to, waiting for them to be fulfilled – promises regarding your family, your future, your ministry, your livelihood? You can be completely certain that God won't let you down.

For each of us as believers there are general promises in the Bible regarding our inheritance as children of God, and we're told in 2 Corinthians 1:20 that all of those promises are 'Yes' in Christ. We therefore need to keep coming back to the Cross to appropriate different aspects of what Jesus accomplished for us when He said, 'It is finished'. Many of us will also have received personal promises from God – rhema words that we are holding on to. He will be utterly faithful to those promises too, but we often need to hold them before Him in prayer, showing Him that we remember and are trusting Him over them. It's a bit like a child who has been promised a treat from his Dad and keeps reminding him about it!

What promises are you holding on to today? Why not speak to God about them and show Him that you're continuing to trust Him for them.

Lectionary Reading; John 6; 24 - 35.

Encountering John. For the next three Sundays, we are reading from the gospel of John these "bread" discourses. Last Sunday, Jesus fed the multitudes with bread, and now he teaches them about bread, hoping to refocus and to expand their notions of what they need most.

A great crowd clamours after Jesus and he knows why. His fame at feeding the multitudes has spread. They are looking for bread. Jesus urges people to seek "the food that endures for eternal life" As usual in the Gospel of John, things have double meanings. Jesus says "bread" but he means much more than "mere" bread. The crowd asks. "What must we do to perform the works of God?" They ask for a sign that will make belief easier. Give us magical bread, like God gave our ancestors in the wilderness. Then Jesus majestically pronounces, " I am the bread of life" Once again, Jesus pulls us out of ourselves and our mundane concerns and lifts us toward himself. It is about Jesus the Christ, the bread of life,

Prayer; Lord Jesus, we suffer from many hungers. We come to you, seeking to be fed, hoping to be filled with all our hearts desire. give us, feed us, bless us, and heal us. Lord Jesus, come to us, not as we would have you to be, but as you are. Lift our desires above our mere bodily needs and toward your kingdom. Feed us, Lord; be for us that bread of life that satisfies always. Amen.
