Welcome to Advent!

And what better place to start Advent than with Mary. Read again the story of Mary's encounter with the angel in Luke 1, and her amazing Song of Praise (traditionally called the Magnificat). This is one of the most painted scenes from the Bible - Mary and the angel, called the Annunciation. My favourite is by Fra Angelico, who was a brother of the St Mark's monastery in Florence. He was commissioned to paint a different painting in each of the brother's rooms, and in the hallway at the top of the stairs leading to their rooms he painted the Annunciation. It is large, almost life size, and shows the actual arches of the monastery courtyard. Mary sits humbly on her stool and the angel leans in to tell her the amazing news that she will give birth to the Son of God. The angel is respectful, almost bowing to her. Both of them seem calm, deeply listening to each other, eye to eye.

If you look up St Marks Angelico Annunciation on Google you can watch a 3 minute video (by the Khan Academy) which describes the painting and its impact.

For us, like for the monks in Florence, artwork can help us be still and open to God. The start of Advent is a good time to be still and expectant: God is here, Christ is coming. I love the intimacy of this painting, which invites us into a closeness with God, even in our homes and bedrooms, wherever we sit, God is there. Look up and see in your mind's eye the brilliance of angel wings. Hear in your inner heart God saying to you: "Peace be with you! The Lord is with you!" Mary heard in that moment how treasured she was to God. I think that God has this same message for each of us.

We will need to encourage mask wearing as folk enter church building. In the meantime, awaiting further guidelines from National Church.
